foundation hires one or more site employees, depending on the ammount of work there is. They ensure that the playgrounds remain tidy and well-maintained. They also do the necessary paint work, once every two to three years. The repair work is carried out by our plygound maker, Jolly Jungle Gym.

Nevertheless, Gelukskinders had an opportunity to have three more playgrounds brought into use by the end of 2021 for children who had to wait for a long time. Playgrounds were placed in "The Hope Of Glory" creche, "Buttons And Bows" kindergarten and "Opang Diatla" school and when Amira doesn't have to go to school herself, she is present at every opening.
